## Check Out This Animated Short for Hans Ulrich Obrist's "Do It" Exhibition

In 1993, **Hans Ulrich Obrist**, **Christian Boltanski**, and **Bertrand Lavier** conceived of an "openended <u>art</u> exhibition" comprised of artists' instructions, taking inspiration from **Marcel Duchamp**'s text-based <u>wedding gift to his sister Suzanne</u> in 1919. The "Do It" exhibition has now had over 50 different variations and will open soon at Moscow's <u>Garage Museum of Contemporary Art</u>.

The video below was made as a companion piece to the exhibition and features narration by comedian Reggie Watts. Watts gives a brief art history lesson (from Duchamp, to **Yoko Ono**, to Obrist) and explains what the exhibition is and how to "Do It."
